Emergency / Out of Hours Advice

At Stamford House we have a 'walk-in' surgery Monday to Friday between 8.30 am and 10.30 am. Please call in between these hours and you will be seen by a doctor.

If you need to see someone straight away for treatment or minor illnesses or accidents and the surgery is closed or there are no available appointments, there are a range of other services on offer:

There is a WALK-IN service at Ashton Primary Care Centre, Old Street which is open from 8 am to 8 pm every day of the year. Their telephone number is 0161 342 7050.

Accident and Emergency departments assess and treat patients with serious injuries or illnesses. Please seek advice either at the surgery or out of hours at the walk-in centre or go-to-doc before presenting to A and E.

Generally you should visit A and E or call 999 for life-threatening emergencies such as loss of consciousness, acute confused state and fits that are not stopping, persistent, severe chest pain, breathing difficulties, severe bleeding that cannot be stopped.

Morning Walk-In Clinics

Following review of patient feedback and consultation with the Patient Participation Group we are trialing a new apmt system for our morning clinics. Patients will still be required to come to the surgery between the hours of 8.30 to 10.30 am. A numbered slot will be given. Patients will be given an approximate time that they will be seen and may leave the premises. We will not allow telephone calls to book apmts or others to come to the surgery to book in on your behalf. Feedback on this system will be appreciated.

Patient Participation Group Action Plan
